Re: Recommended Appointments to the Healthy Families Program (HFP)
Advisory Panel

MRMIB staff advertised the eight vacancies on the HFP Advisory Panel on February 9, 2011 and solicited interested individuals. The Board received multiple applications for only one of the eight available vacancies and also received notice from three incumbent panel members that wanted to continue their public service. However, staff did not receive any interested parties for two of the eight available vacancies. We will continue outreach efforts to fill those vacancies and return with additional staff recommendations at a future Board Meeting. The following are vacancies that require on-going recruitment:

- Subscriber With Special Needs Child; and
- Disproportionate Share Hospital Provider.

Listed below are the staff recommendations for the six of the eight vacancies:

1. Education Representative:

Staff recommends the reappointment of Mr. Jack Campana. Mr. Campana is a Senior Scientist for the Education Development Center in San Diego. He has contributed his educational experience and background in reviewing topics that are brought before the Advisory Panel. Mr. Campana is an active participant on the HFP Advisory Panel and has chaired the Panel since January 1, 2003.

2. Mental Health Provider Representative:

Staff recommends the reappointment of Mr. William Arroyo, M.D., Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health. Dr. Arroyo has many years experience with public health insurance programs, including Medi-Cal, Healthy Families, Healthy

Kids and the Access for Infants & Mothers programs. He directs the provision of county mental health services in Los Angeles County. He is an active participant on the HFP Advisory Panel and has been serving on the Panel since January 1, 2005.

3. Health Plan Representative:

Staff recommends the reappointment of Ms. Barbara Orozco-Valdivia, Community Solutions Supervisor, Health Net. Ms. Orozco-Valdivia has many years experience in working with public health insurance programs, including Medi-Cal, Healthy Families, Healthy Kids and the Access for Infants & Mothers programs. She has coordinated regional outreach efforts by Enrollment Entities and Certified Application Assistants in the San Diego and Los Angeles regions for many years. She is an active participant on the HFP Advisory Panel and has been serving on the Panel since January 1, 2008.

4. Dentist Representative:

Staff recommends the appointment of James Forester, DDS. Dr. Forester is a Board Certified Pediatric Dentist at a community clinic in Paso Robles. He has many years experience in working with public health programs, including Medi-Cal, Healthy Families, Healthy Kids and the Access for Infants & Mothers programs. He has devoted his career to the treatment of underserved infants, children and adolescents including those with special health care needs. His nomination is supported by both the California Dental Association and the California Society of Pediatric Dentistry.

5. Subscriber Representative:

Staff recommends the appointment of Mr. Davis Rivera. Mr. Rivera is both a parent of an HFP subscriber and has been a Certified Application Assistant since February 2002. He is a 211 Specialist for the United Way of Stanislaus County in Modesto. His experience and background will provide valuable input from the "grass roots" level and an understanding of the Healthy Families Program from a subscriber perspective.

6. County Public Health Provider:

Staff recommends the appointment of Dr. Susan Fernyak, MD, MPH. Dr. Fernyak has worked at the San Francisco Department of Public Health since 1998 as both a clinician at San Francisco General Hospital and within the Communicable Disease Control. For the past eight years, she has served as the Deputy Health Officer and as Director of Communicable Disease Control and Prevention Section. She has many years experience in working with public health programs, including Medi-Cal, Healthy Families, Healthy Kids and the Access for Infants & Mothers programs.
