MRMIB staff advertised the five vacancies on the HFP Advisory Panel on January 11, 2010 and solicited interested individuals. The Board received multiple applications for two of the five available vacancies and also received notice of incumbent panel members that want to continue their public service. Listed below are the staff recommendations for the five vacancies.

Business Representative

Staff recommends reappointment of Ronald DiLuigi. Mr DiLuigi is Vice President of Advocacy, Government Relations & Public Policy for the St. Joseph Health System in Orange. He has held progressively responsible executive positions during a 30 year career in government, most recently as the Director of the Orange County Health Care Agency. Mr. DiLuigi is an active participant on the HFP Advisory Panel.

Non-Profit Clinic

Staff recommends the appointment of Karen Lauterbach, Manager of Community Health Insurance Program at Venice Family Clinic in Los Angeles. Ms. Lauterbach has twelve years of experience with public health insurance programs including Medi-Cal, Healthy Families, Healthy Kids, AIM and Kaiser Health Plan. She is involved in many outreach and enrollment coalitions focusing on reducing the uninsured, streamlining enrollment and is also Certified Application Assistant. She is an active participant on the HFP Advisory Panel.

Subscriber with Special Needs Child

Staff recommends the reappointment of Irma Hernandez. She is the parent of an HFP child with special needs and lives in Sacramento County. She has been the one of the subscriber voices on the panel and provides the additional perspective of the challenges faced by children with special needs.

Practicing Pediatrician

Staff recommends the appointment of Maria Tupas, MD, FAAP. Dr. Tupas has been a practicing Pediatrician in California for nearly 20 years and has served HFP subscribers since the program's inception. She is the Medical Director of Primary Care Clinics at Children's Hospital of Orange County and has served as the President of her local chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Substance Abuse Provider

Staff recommends reappointment of Elizabeth Stanley-Salazar. Ms Stanley Salazar is regarded as an expert in the field of substance abuse prevention, is a member of the Board of Directors of the Alcohol and Drug Policy Institute and Director at Phoenix Houses of California in Los Angeles. She is an active participant on the HFP Advisory Panel.


Dear Ms Cummings

Please consider this as Part II of my application for the Representative from a Licensed Nonprofit Primary Care Clinic vacancy on the Healthy Families Program Advisory Panel.

I have been employed at the Venice Family Clinic for over nine years. The Venice Family Clinic is the largest free clinic in the nation. We serve almost 22,000 unduplicated patients in over 106,000 annual visits. In the effort to provide a medical home for its patients, the Clinic has made strong efforts to provide ancillary services for its patients. One of these programs is the *Community Health Insurance Program*, which I have been fortunate to help create and implement. In 1999, we created a new department that sought to educate our patients, staff and community on the benefits of the newly created “Healthy Families Program”. Our Clinic’s goal was to educate and then assist with patient enrollment through the onerous process of a 24-page application.

Today, the Clinic’s *Community Health Insurance Program* outreaches to 3,000 individuals and enrolls and case manages about 2,000 patients and community residents per year. Our program is a product of our daily interactions with clients, our staff’s input and the sharing of lessons learned through collaboration. We created a curriculum to educate our families on health insurance benefits & utilization. This has been beneficial in particular to families with children who have multiple health plans. We provide case management, retention services and work closely with our physicians to encourage our patients to enroll and retain their health insurance.

Through mentorship by the Clinic’s Associate Director, my involvement in the health insurance programs has deepened. Initially, this involvement began with the barrier the application presented to our patients; I was encouraged to seek opportunities for input and collaboration from local, county and state agencies to change the Healthy Family Application Process. Today, I participate at local, county and state level in collaborative efforts such as the Health and Nutrition Access and the Covering Kids and Families Coalition.



Internal to the Clinic, I work with staff to improve health insurance delivery and streamline systems with our billing, registration and provider departments. Since 2004, I have participated in the Los Angeles process to implement One E-App and currently sit on the One E-App Operations Leadership Committee. Beginning January 31st, the Venice Family Clinic will pilot the One E-App. I am committed to assisting clients with products and systems that improve efficiency while staying committed to serving the client. I am a Certified Application Assistor (CAA) and work alongside my staff to enroll, case manage, educate our patients on health insurance programs.

I understand, on a very personal level, the consequences resulting from a lack of health care coverage. My family comes from the rural South where a lack of access to health care has provided me concrete examples of the real life effects created by an absence of health care coverage. I also understand the issues associated with accessing public programs. When I was a young single mother, going to school full time, I gained valuable knowledge in this area. This knowledge, today, has impacted my patient contact and helped me identify ways to create a simpler system that is aligned with state and federal regulations and that works for families.

Healthy Families is a program that makes a difference in people's lives, I see it in the patients we serve. I would like the opportunity to serve on the HFP Advisory Panel where I believe my professional skills and personal experience support this position's scope of responsibility. This includes experience in creating a health insurance program at a licensed primary care clinic; personally enrolling patients and case managing them, supervising staff and being responsible for the management of our *Community Health Insurance Program* that serves approximately 5,000 clients per year from our clinic and community; networking and collaborating to affect public policy and streamline processes through participation in advisory committees for the creation and implementation of the One E-App. I believe I can be a valuable asset to this Advisory Panel. I am eager to serve at this level.
